PRIVATE INVESTIGATION

When investigating the cause of allergic symptoms, two types of tests may be used: a skin prick (or scratch) test and a blood test. The patient's medical history is also taken into consideration when diagnosing an allergy. In a skin prick test, which may cause reactions such as swelling and itching of the skin, a bit of the suspected allergen is scratched into the skin's surface. Typically, results of a skin test can be determined shortly after it is administered.

Blood tests can be used to determine allergies to insect stings, pollen, mold, and animal dander. Some discomfort may occur when blood is drawn. Blood tests results take longer to obtain than skin test results. Blood tests may be used if the patient history is severe enough that we do not wish to expose the patient to the allergen(s) in question, even in very dilute form, or if the patient is unable to stop allergy medications briefly for skin testing.
